**NOW THAT YOU KNOW,
WHAT WILL YOU DO?**

Many people have no signs or symptoms of STDs and/or they may not recognize them. Untreated STDs can lead to serious health problems. Syphilis, like many other STDs, facilitates the spread of HIV by increasing the likelihood of transmission.

STDs pose a serious public health threat, particularly young women, African Americans, Men who have sex with men (MSM) and those living in poverty or with limited access to health care.

Florida in 2010

270 cases of STD were diagnosed each day.

11 cases of STD were diagnosed each hour.

1 was diagnosed every 5.26 minutes.

67% of all reported cases of STDs were between the age of 15 to 24.

Nationally

19 million new cases are diagnosed every year.

1 in 4 teens contracts an STD each year.

1 in 2 sexually active persons will contract an STD.

Miami -Dade County in 2010

Experienced an increase in all reportable STDs. The increases are:

Chlamydia up 7.7%

Gonorrhea up 7.9%

Infectious Syphilis up 18.8%

A real concern for us is that over 60% of persons diagnosed with syphilis are also co-infected with HIV!
