STDs and Teens Statistics & Trends

Stats from the DOH Bureau of STD Prevention and Control - 2011 stats are provisional as of January 2012

Floridians 15 to 19 Years Old in 2011

- Approximately 80 Cases of STDs are diagnosed every day.
- Approximately 3 Cases of STDs are diagnosed every hour.
- Approximately 1 Case of an STD is diagnosed every 20 minutes.

Floridians 15 to 19 Years Old in 2011

- Approximately 182 Cases of STDs are diagnosed every day.
- Approximately 8 Cases of STDs are diagnosed every hour.
- Approximately 1 Case of an STD is diagnosed every 8 minutes

Floridians ALL Ages in 2011

- Approximately 288 new cases of STDs are diagnosed every day
- Approximately 12 Cases of STDs are diagnosed every hour.
- Approximately 1 Case of an STD is diagnosed every 5 minutes

Miami—Dade County

During 2011, we had a decrease in all reportable STDs (not including HIV) except for Chlamydia which is found mostly in teens. Chlamydia is both curable and treatable! But remember that HIV is transmitted the same way, so teens are not protecting themselves.

15 to 24 Years Old in Miami—Dade for 2011

- Approximately 20 individuals are diagnosed with an STD every day.
- Approximately 1 individual is diagnosed with an STD every hour.
- During the time it takes to attend an average day at school, 7 of their fellow students are diagnosed with an STD.

All Ages in Miami—Dade for 2011

- Approximately 34 individuals are diagnosed with an STD every day.
- Approximately 1.5 individuals are diagnosed with an STD every hour.
- During the time it takes to attend a Miami Heat game, 4 people are diagnosed with an STD.

What You Can Do to Help a Teen

- ◆ Let teens know that they can be tested and treated for STDs without parental consent. And it is so easy.
- ◆ Learn about signs, symptoms prevention and resources including testing sites so you can help with the factual information. You may be the only one they will talk to. If you can't, refer them to someone who can.
- ◆ Make sexual health part of your overall health and “Make Health Happen!”
- ◆ Get teens to practice negotiating skills and prompt them to support each other in making safer choices.
- ◆ Promote personal responsibility by encouraging teens to disclose their STD to a partner. The Health Department can help let a partner know about a possible exposure without giving the teens name or any information about them. Have discussions about safe and healthy relationships (examples: sexting, date rape, teen pregnancy, substance use).
